

1. A report of a UFO was received from Mr. Dale F. Spaur, Badge #15, Portage County Sheriff's Office, Ravenna, Ohio., 17 Apr 66. Sighting between 0300 and 0600 hours. "First sighted in Ravenna, Ohio along Routes 224 - 44, followed object to Conway, Pa., for about 80 miles. Object seemed to be taking off from ground, oblong shaped, with antenna projecting from it. There were no colored lights only a very bright silvery radiance. Object flying about 500 feet over vehicle. It would show down in speed and then go very fast. The glow from object was so bright it blinded driver of vehicle. Object was flying due east. This was witnessed by people along the route between Ravenna, Ohio and Conway, Pa. There were three (3) men from sheriff's office and two (2) patrol cars that followed object along this route."

2. After the report was received a call was made to the Airport Tower at Greater Pittsburg Airport. Nothing had been picked up on radar at the airport. The Air National Guard, also located at Greater Pittsburgh Airport had been called but not by this organization. F-102's were not scrambled to follow the UFO.

3. Mr. Tom Schley, Beaver County Times, called 0815 hours 18 Apr 66 requesting info on UFO. He mentioned that a photo of the UFO had been taken. Local news media publicized the fact that a photo of the UFO had also been taken but was not being released by the sheriff's office but would be turned over to the Federal Government. Rochester Police and Conway Police were contacted by this office 18 Apr 66. No information concerning UFO was received. Any connection with sighting of UFO was denied.

He had called Lt Weisinger, FTD Duty Officer on 17 Apr 66. I have several prints and negative. The Lt said not to release them. Major explained that he was free to release them or do whatever he wished to do with them. He said the Lt didn't exactly say not to release them but said to hold onto them. Major explained to him that we would like to have the negatives so that we could blow them up. Said he would send them registered mail and asked that we send him a letter stating that we got them. Major explained that he was the officer in charge of the project. Buchert said he wasn't too sure how he should go about reporting his observation. Had a Dacon lens, with fixed lens at 14. No speed, 127 Black and White, thought it was Ansco film. Observed object for 15-20 minutes. It was stopped, didn't appear to be moving, when it did move then went up and down and went back to its same position, left to the right, like it was tilting, went SE, on state route 44. The pictures were taken in front of my farm. Major explained that he could do whatever he wanted to do with the film as far as releasing goes, he could even sell them. Buchert said he would feel kind of silly. He would send them to us registered mail along with ~~with~~ his police report. Said it wasn't a star, plane, or balloon. Looks like two saucers in prints. One object. Major told him we would send him an official report.

REPORT BY TELEPHONE CONVERSATION 18 APRIL 1966

SHERIFF SPAUR, RAVENNA, OHIO.

0506 when I got back from my cruiser, I was checking an abandoned vehicle on 224, very bright light, first attracted. Came from West in an eastern direction, passed over us to the North side of the highway. I believe there was a partial moon due East of us. There was one other object like a star, right of the moon on South of moon at 3 o'clock. The only shape was the roundness of it, unperfect circle, egg shaped, almost like oblong, but not real oblong. So bright that we couldn't look directly at it. It came out of a deep wooded area. Came from the West towards us. We just disregarded it at first. Just a routine patrol. Partner he also observed it. He was to the right of the car. Thought someone might come walking out of the woods. Waited to make sure no one was walking behind us. Very low on the horizon. The other car was watching it from two roads above it. It was not more than 150 feet over the one area. Didn't have a red light. No wind. When it came over us it lighted the whole area. The ground was lighted by this object. Like looking at arc welder, blue-white light. The only sound heard was a humming sound like a power transformer, no thrust like from a jet. No sudden surge of power. It went to the north side of the road. Angled slightly, bottom came across 224 on the south side of road, started going East. Slow movement. We ran back and had a camera. Kept under surveillance till it could be possibly photographed. Those were our instructions after we had called in. The Mantua Police had photographed the object. We have a copy from Mantua. Major Quintanilla explained

to Sheriff Spaur that we were interested in the negative then we could blow it up. Spaur said he was pretty sure the sheriff would give it to us. Object was first going 80 - 83 mph.

Had to make a turn on the roadway. The vehicle stayed right with us and came back to its line. 103 - 104 mph. Followed it through Mahony county into Columbia County. Cruiser with Patrolman Houston observed object. Object got ahead of us once. It seemed as if we were going to lose it. It dropped 500 ft alt. At route 51 that thing was waiting on us. Started moving again, East Palestine into Conway, Pennsylvania, till 15 miles from Greater Pittsburgh Airport. Running out of fuel. Conway had been watching the object. It was after 6 am when they stopped looking at it.

Monday, 18 April 66, Aiman Elmer placed a call to Sulpher Grove to find out the general wind directions in the eastern ohio area. Winds were westerly from the surface up. They launced a weather balloon at 0030 and it would not have been the cause of the sighting.

Photo Analysis, of the negative submitted by Chief of Police Gerald F. Buchert, Mantua, Ohio, indicates that the "very bright light" which he tried to photograph does not appear as an image. The two images which appear on the negative are probably the result of processing defects due to old fogged film and poor handling. If the object was "bright" against a dark sky the images should be plus density, however, they were not. The average background density was 1.25, the image density was 1.06.

The probable cause of the sighting by Deputy Sheriff Spaur of Ravenna, Ohio was the passage of a satellite over northeastern Ohio. As the satellite approached the southeast portion of the sky, the satellite disappeared and Deputy Sheriff Dale F. Spaur focused his eyes on the planet Venus. Venus was rising in the southeast and was at a magnitude of -3.9 which would be brighter than other stars in the sky. It is believed that Deputy Sheriff Spaur was chasing the planet Venus. Radar indicates that no airborne objects were in the area of the sighting during the period that Deputy Sheriff Spaur was chasing the UFO.

Flying Saucer Leads Sheriff On Fast Chase

RAVENNA, Ohio (AP) — "We were close, closer than I ever want to be again," said a deputy sheriff who chased an unidentified flying object from Ohio into Pennsylvania.

Hundreds of persons in both states reported seeing the "brilliant and shiny" object early Sunday morning.

Police Chief Gerald Buchert of Mantua, about eight miles north of Ravenna, said he took a picture of the object from his front yard but the Air Force told him not to release it.

Buchert said it looked like "two table saucers put together."

Deputy Sheriff Dale Spaur said he and his partner, W. L. Neff, "were close" to the object in separate cars and chased it 86 miles for an hour and a half.

from near Ravenna to Conway, Pa., near Pittsburgh.

Spaur said he clocked it at speeds up to 103 miles per hour. From the ground Spaur said it looked like the head of a flashlight, about 40 feet wide and 18 feet high.

Spaur said the lines of the object were very distinct. "Somebody had control over it," he said. "It wasn't just floating around. It can maneuver."

The deputy said the chase slowed down near Rochester, Pa., when the cars "got tangled up in a mess of bridges. But when I came out from under the bridge it came down and waited for us, just as though it knew these two cars were following it."

"I know nobody's going to believe it, but it's true," he said.

Spaur said the only sound coming from the object was a steady, faint humming, like an electric transformer. Near Conway, Pa., Spaur said the object began hovering and "was going for altitude, straight up."

He said the object disappeared after he and others went to a police station to telephone Air Force officials.

The Federal Aviation Agency's air traffic control centers at Oberlin, Ohio, and Pittsburgh said they had spotted no unknown objects on their radar.

UFO Near Reading

READING, Pa. (UPI) — A family in suburban Fleetwood reported they watched an unidentified flying object (UFO) hovering near their home for more than an hour early Sunday.

Mr. and Mrs. Harold Lebo said the object emitted no sounds but changed colors from bright yellow to red and blue. Lebo said he called his three sons to the window and they watched the object through a small telescope. They said it rose slowly until it was high in the sky and appeared like a morning star before it vanished in the sunrise.

When I recently served in Washington as the Congressman from the 11th District, I was often amazed at the number and variety of letters I would receive from certain of my constituents complaining about the action or inaction of various federal officials or employees.

However, as a result of recent events here in Portage County, I believe I now better understand why citizens write their Congressman when upset with certain federal personnel.

I am writing to complain about the attitude and actions of representatives of the United States Air Force at Wright-Patterson Field in reference to reports of UFO sightings in Portage County. On April 17th at about 3:00 A. M. two deputies of the Portage County Sheriff's office, Dale Spaur and Wilbur Neff, and the Chief of Police of Mantua, Gerald Buchert, reported that they observed an object in the air over Portage County and the two deputies stated that they chased this object some 85 miles before they were forced to give up their pursuit.

Deputies Spaur and Neff said that they had a good look at the object and at times it was within 100 feet of them. Chief Buchert took a picture of what he saw from a greater distance.

Several police officers along the 85 mile route taken by the Portage County officers confirm their report.

It is my understanding that units of the United States Air Force at Wright-Patterson Field are charged by the United States Air Force with the responsibility to investigate reports of Unidentified Flying Objects in this area.

It is my further understanding that their investigation of these sightings has merely consisted of telephone conversations with several of the eye witnesses and an examination of the photographs taken by Chief Buchert.

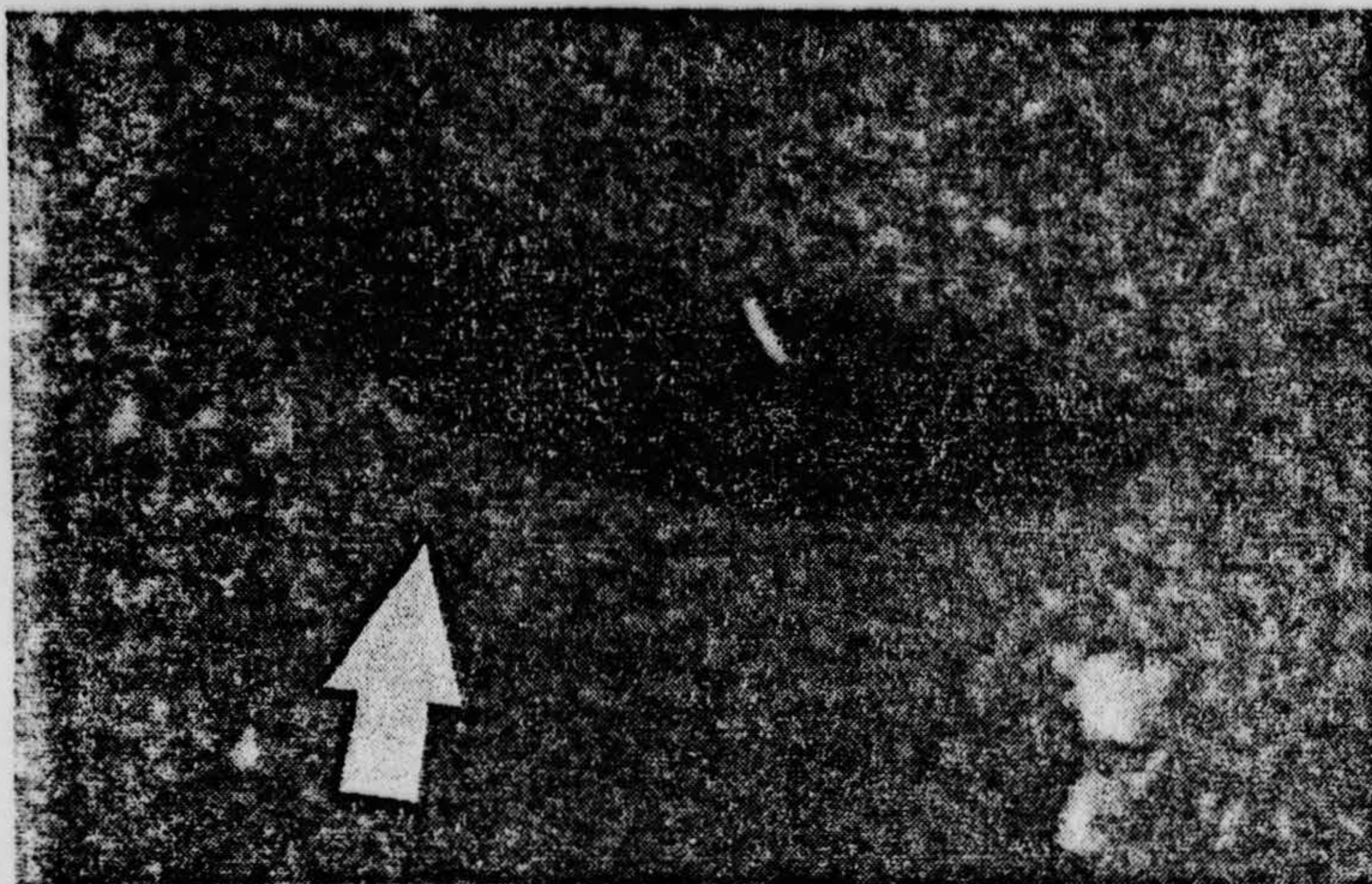

UFO Almost Makes It to Pittsburgh

'Saucer' Flies From Ohio to Pa.

An Unidentified Flying Object (Flying Saucer to you, Charlie) shaped like an ice-cream cone almost made it to Pittsburgh yesterday, but apparently got headed off at the pass by some over-zealous Ohio policemen.

A "very bright, cone-shaped object, some 35 to 45 feet across the top and about 24 feet high," was first spotted south of Akron, Ohio, by Portage County Sheriff's Deputy W. L. Neff, who gave the above description, about 5 a. m.

He added that the object, which seemed to be able to navigate by itself, gave off a faint humming noise.

This greatly interested Deputy Neff, who reportedly believes in flying saucers, and he took up the chase south-eastward toward Pennsylvania along U.S. Routes 422 and 14 at speeds ranging from 80 to 100 miles an hour.

Near East Palestine, Ohio, he was joined by an East Palestine deputy police officer, Wayne Huston, also on patrol, and the two of them followed the object across the state line into Pennsylvania.

Near Conway, Beaver County, they lost it.

But hundreds of other people had sighted the object by this time and calls were coming to police switchboards as

well as to an Air Force Reserve unit near Youngstown and to the Federal Aviation Agency at Greater Pittsburgh Airport.

Pilots were up in jet trainers almost immediately from the Youngstown base, but complained that the object—speed of which was estimated at just over 100 miles an hour—was moving too slowly for them to keep up with it. Or down.

Clever saucer, playing our own technology off against us . . . !

At Greater Pittsburgh Airport nothing showed up on

the radar screen. A Federal Aviation Agency official there stated later in the morning that there weren't any airplanes, either in the area where the saucer was sighted—at least not at 5 o'clock in the morning.

That was a point for saucer fans.

Conway police said they neither heard nor saw any UFO and weren't about to speak of it, and wished in general that newsmen would stop bothering them.

With the coming of full daylight, apparently, the saucer faded—or flew—or teleported—away, leaving us earthlings to sort the whole thing out.

OBJECT DISAPPEARS NEAR CONWAY

UFO Chased Into County

By TOM SCHLEY

An 86-mile high-speed chase after an unidentified flying object (UFO) ended in Conway Sunday morning nearly an hour after it began in Ohio.

Conway Patrolman Frank Panzanella said he saw what prompted two sheriff's deputies and a policeman from Ohio to drive at speeds 80 to 105 miles per hour in pursuit of the "flying saucer."

The two deputies from Portage County, Ohio, Dale Spaur and W. L. Neff, began the chase shortly after 5 a.m. on Ohio Route 224 near Atwater, south of Akron and southeast of Ravenna, the Portage County seat.

At about the same time, Police Chief Gerald Buchert of Mantua, Ohio, snapped a photo of the object from some distance while he and his wife stood in their front yard about 10 miles north of Ravenna.

Spaur and Neff, on instructions, pursued the brightly lighted object alone down Ohio Route 14. They were joined at East Palestine by Patrolman Wayne Huston of that city in another police cruiser.

The two cars sped on into Pennsylvania, down Route 51 to Rochester and then on Route 65 to Conway. At Conway they spotted Panzanella in his parked cruiser at a service station. They stopped there since Spaur

was running low on gas. He also had burned a new set of tires bald from the high speed chase.

The three Ohio men asked Panzanella if he had seen the object and he pointed it out to them. He had seen it a few minutes earlier from the top of 11th Street hill but hadn't thought much about it at that time.

Panzanella told the TIMES

that when he first saw the brightly lighted object he thought it was a reflection from the rising sun off an airplane. He came off the hill and spotted the object again just before the Ohio men arrived.

He called Rochester radio base station to have the Greater Pittsburgh Airport contacted, and the four men watched for about 20 minutes as the object rose "straight up" until it was barely visible.

Spaur and Panzanella both said they had heard that the Air Force had sent jets up after the object. There were reports that jet trainers from Youngstown went up but the object, traveling about 100 miles per hour, was moving too slowly for them to stay with it.

A Federal Aviation Agency official at Greater Pittsburgh Airport said the object wasn't spotted on radar nor were there any planes in the area where the object was sighted at that time.

The four men viewing from Conway said a plane that apparently took off from the airport passed right through the area below the unidentified object they were watching.

Air Force personnel at the airport would make no statement about the sighting other than to say that officials at Wright Patterson Air Force Base, Dayton, Ohio, had been notified. Official Air Force investigations of UFO's are handled from Wright Patterson.

SPAUR, 35, a former Air Force gunner, told the TIMES Sunday that he and Neff were checking an abandoned car when they spotted a strange light through the trees. He said the object came over the trees along the highway and directly over their patrol car, about 150 feet above them.

He said the bottom of the object was very brightly lighted and the light from the bottom gave the appearance of a cone shape. It lighted up the area around the car like daylight and they could not look directly at the bright white light when it was shining on them, he said.

Spaur said the object had no apparent effect on him and Neff or on the car. It was about 35 feet to 40 feet across and about 18 to 24 feet high, he said.

Spaur said he became frightened and he and Neff ran for the car. He reported the sighting to police headquarters in Ravenna and was told to keep the object under surveillance as long as possible.

Thus the chase began.

MEANWHILE, Chief Buchert in Mantua had monitored a report to Portage County from the Summit County Sheriff's Office in Akron about a strange light that had been spotted.

Buchert was on Main Street in Mantua when he first spotted the object overhead. He said it looked like two saucers with their rims placed together and the bottoms facing out.

He said it was very brilliant and a bright white or silver with no coloring of any type. He reported it to the Portage sheriff's office and said Spaur reported it shortly after that.

Buchert went home and awakened his wife to show her the

object. It had moved off to some distance and Buchert used an inexpensive camera from the police car to shoot three pictures of the object. He told the TIMES that only one of the three exposures turned out.

He planned not to release the picture to anyone until after he conferred with government officials.

An enlargement of the photograph indistinctly shows one object which Buchert said was the moon and a dark disc shaped object surrounded by a ring of light to the right of the moon.

THE ONLY noise Spaur heard that might have come from the object was when it was first spotted. He said he heard a faint, steady humming noise similar to an electrical transformer.

His main thought throughout the chase was to remain as calm as possible and do everything he could to verify the sighting and get a description of it.

He said this included keeping it in sight as the sun rose so as to have seen it in both darkness and daylight.

Spaur said the object didn't make any attempt to get away and it followed the main highway almost as "if it knew it."

Deputy Robert Wilson, the radio operator at Ravenna, said the object was reported by at least six or seven other police departments in Ohio.

Huston told the TIMES he was in radio contact with Spaur and he first spotted the object over Route 14 when Spaur was still about five miles away.

He fell in behind Spaur and said the object was about 800 to 900 feet in the air and mostly remained directly ahead of them.

Spaur said that both cruisers clocked the speed of the object at 103 miles per hour.

Huston had his headquarters telephone Pennsylvania State Police at Chippewa Barracks about the chase, but none of the state police cars were near Route 51 at the time.

He said that they lost sight of the object near the entrance to Bradys Run Park when trucks stopped at the traffic light forced them to slow up.

They continued through Fallston, and just after passing the P&LE Railroad underpass in Bridgewater, they again spotted the object in the direction of Rochester. At Rochester it was directly ahead of them again.

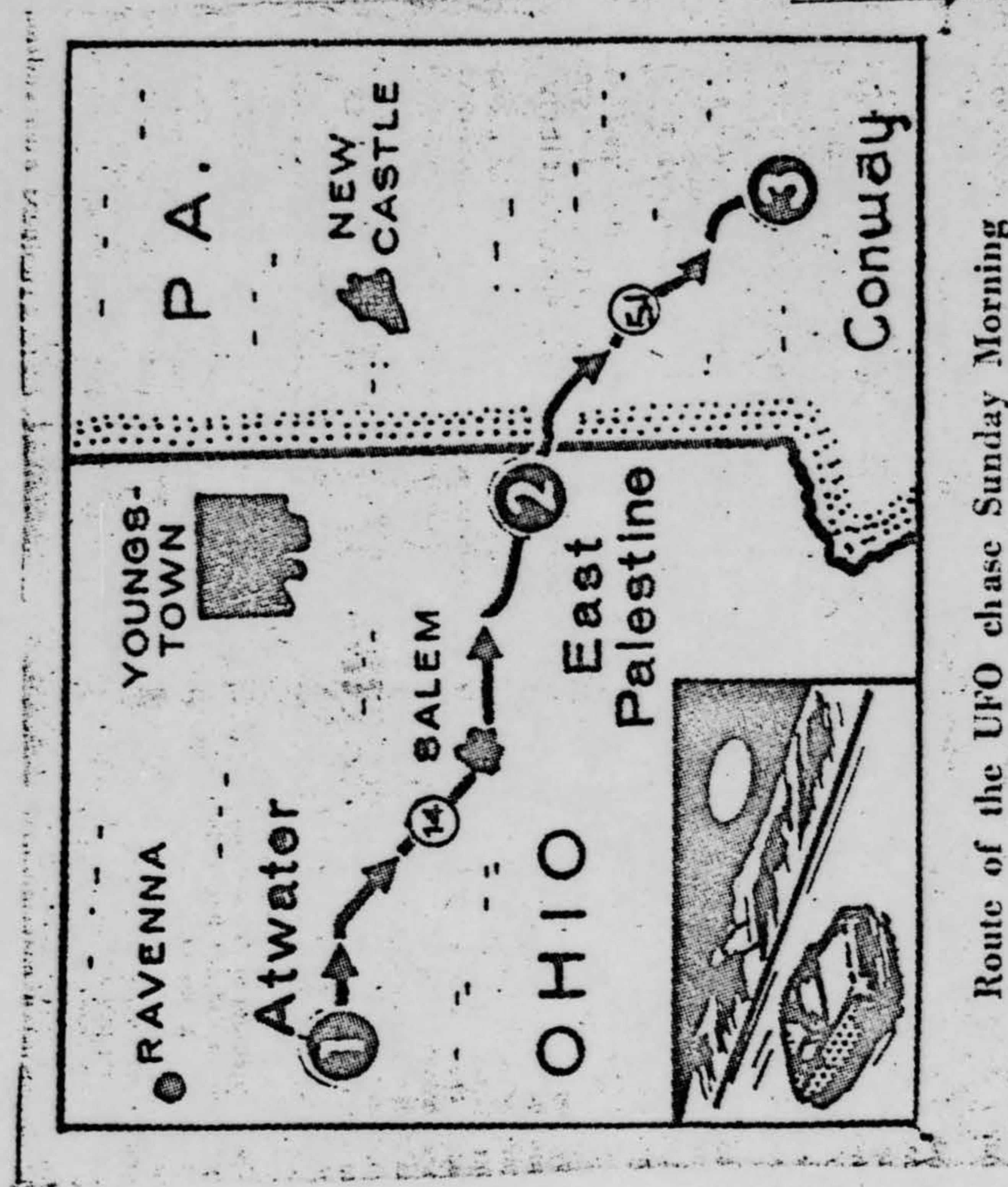
Spaur said the object also seemed to wait for them to get through the bridges at Rochester and back onto the open boulevard before it continued at its regular speed.

Spaur said the object definitely was controlled because it could change speed, and gain or lose altitude. "When it wants to go up, it doesn't play around," he said. When he thought they had lost it for good at Bradys Run it seemed as if it had waited for them to catch up again, Spaur said.

When shown the picture taken by James Lucci, Brighton Township last August, Spaur told the TIMES it looked very much like the object he had seen.

William Weitzel, chairman of the Pittsburgh subcommittee for the National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomena, who investigated the Lucci sighting, was in Ravenna Sunday and today to investigate this latest sighting.

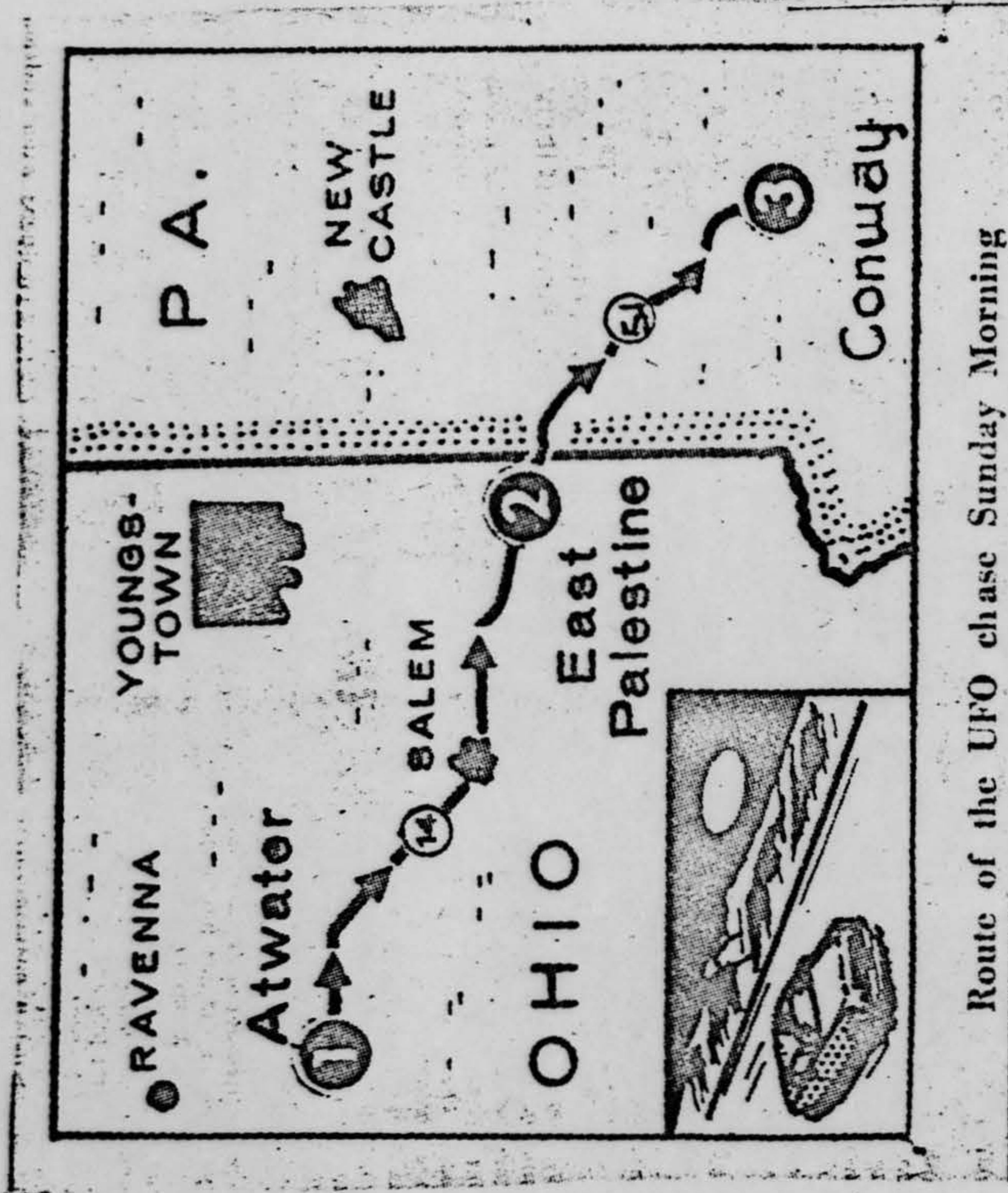
Air Force personnel were expected in Ravenna today to investigate the sighting and to look at Buchert's photograph.

Their conclusion that the object sighted was the planet Venus is so ridiculous that the United States Air Force has suffered a great loss of prestige in this community.

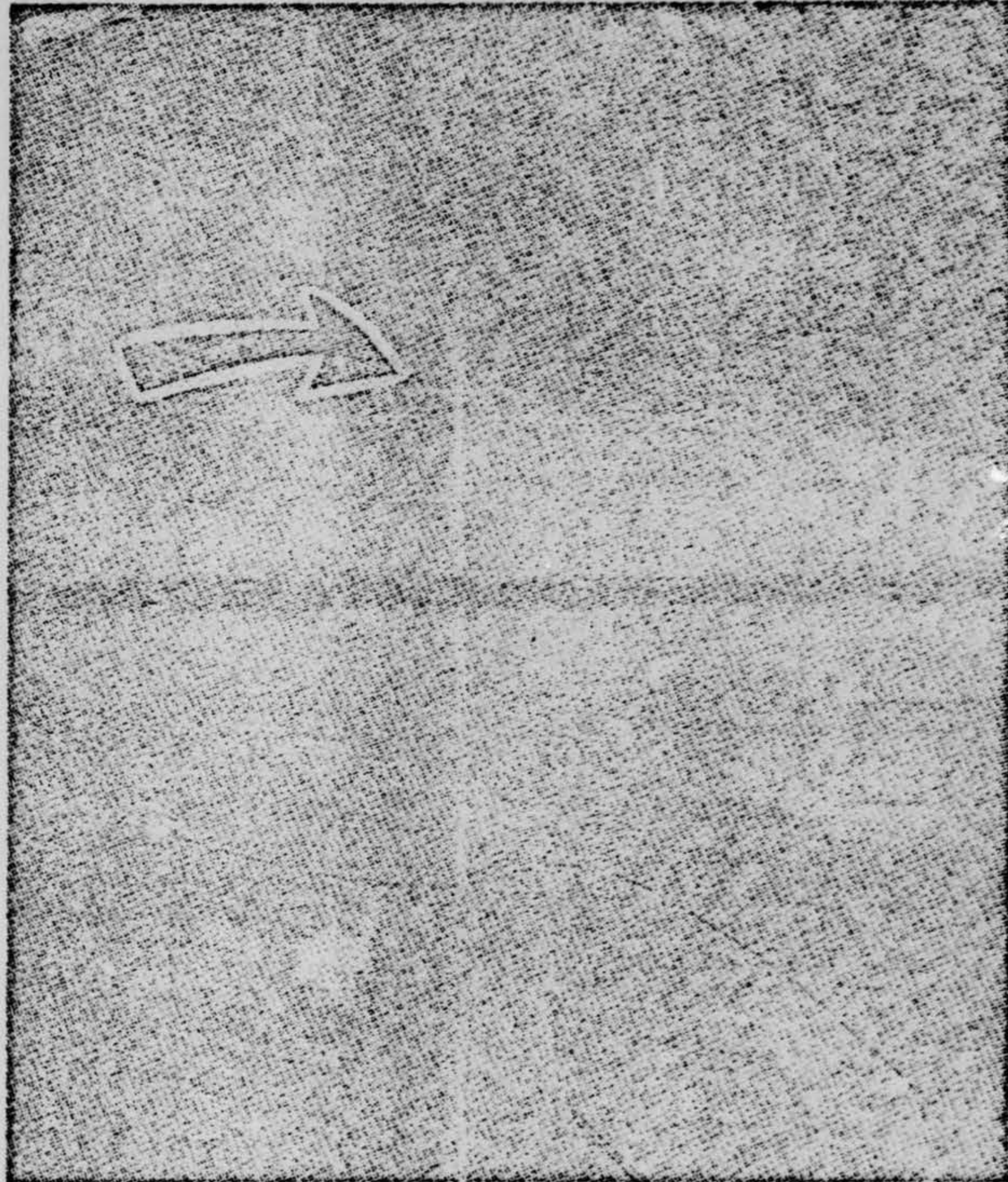

Chief Saw the Saucer And Got the Picture

While hundreds of Western Pennsylvania and Eastern Ohio residents gawked at this area's first flying saucer early Sunday morning, Police Chief Gerald Buchert of Mantua, Ohio, did something beautifully simple.

He took a picture.

When the picture was developed, there it was.

"Well," said Mrs. Buchert to the Post-Gazette yesterday, "it looked like a . . . saucer."

One feels a little silly saying things like that in the daytime, with the sun shining.

But it was different at 5 a. m. Sunday when Chief Buchert dragged her out of bed and they watched the bright object maneuver its way across the sky.

While they were watching,

Portage County Ohio sheriff's deputies W. L. Neff and Dale Spaur, in separate cars, were chasing the object into Pennsylvania at speeds up to 103 miles an hour.

At East Palestine, Ohio, Patrolman Wayne Huston took up the chase, and the three police cars sped all the way to Conway, Beaver County, where the "object" disappeared.

worth 10 thousand words, and anyone who tries to put together a rational description of the saucer from the eyewitness reports had better believe it.

►Chief Buchert: "It looked like two table saucers put together."

►Mrs. Buchert: "It was a round, bright, white object, and when it tilted or turned it had a ring around the middle of it."

►Sheriff's Deputy Spaur: "It looked like the head of a flashlight, about 40 feet wide and 18 feet high."

►Sheriff's Deputy Neff: "It was a very bright, cone-shaped object, some 35 to 45 feet across the top and about 24 feet high."

Chief Buchert was the man with the picture, but he had some initial trouble with the Air Force. He called Project Bluebook, the Air Force UFO headquarters at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base near Dayton, and a spokesman told him he could release the picture if he wished but they'd rather he didn't.

Taking the hint, Chief Buchert kept it to himself over Sunday.

Yesterday morning an Air Force spokesman from Washington called Buchert and told him to go ahead and release the picture if he hadn't already done so.

The saucer's strange behavior had apparently frightened one of the pursuers, Deputy Spaur. "We were close, closer than I ever want to be again," he said.

Spaur said the lines of the object were very distinct. "Somebody had control over it," he said. "It wasn't just floating around. It can maneuver."

Explanation Of UFO Rejected

The Air Force's explanation of the sighting of an unidentified flying object April 17 in Ohio and Beaver County isn't being accepted by one of the men who saw the UFO. Sheriff's Deputy Dale Spaur of Portage County, Ohio.

In a report issued over the weekend, the Air Force said:

"The probable cause of the sighting by Sheriff Dale F. Spaur, of Ravenna, Ohio, was the passage of a satellite. As it approached the southeast portion of the sky, it disappeared, and Sheriff Spaur focused his eyes on the planet Venus.

"Venus was rising in the southeast and was brighter than any star in the sky. It is believed that Sheriff Spaur saw the planet Venus."

SPAUR isn't buying that explanation. He said Saturday "I don't know how much of an investigation they made, but evidently it wasn't a very lengthy one and it didn't involve me."

He said he had two brief phone conversations with Maj. Hector Quintanilla, head of "Project Blue Book," the Air Force official UFO investigation project. They lasted about two and a half and one and a half minutes, he said.

"First of all, I don't think there is a satellite that can go this low and I don't think we have one this large or that it can stop or go or maneuver anytime. I'm definitely sure I wasn't chasing Venus running wildly over the countryside."

Spaur and his partner W. L. "Barney" Neff chased the object, which Spaur described as about 35 to 40 feet across with a very bright, white glow. He said that the chase started after the object hovered directly over their heads about 150 feet in the air south of Ravenna.

They were joined in the chase at East Palestine by Patrolman Wayne Huston, who also reported seeing the object. Their chase ended at Conway, where they found Patrolman Frank Panzanella along Route 65. The four said they watched the object for about 20 minutes in Conway.
